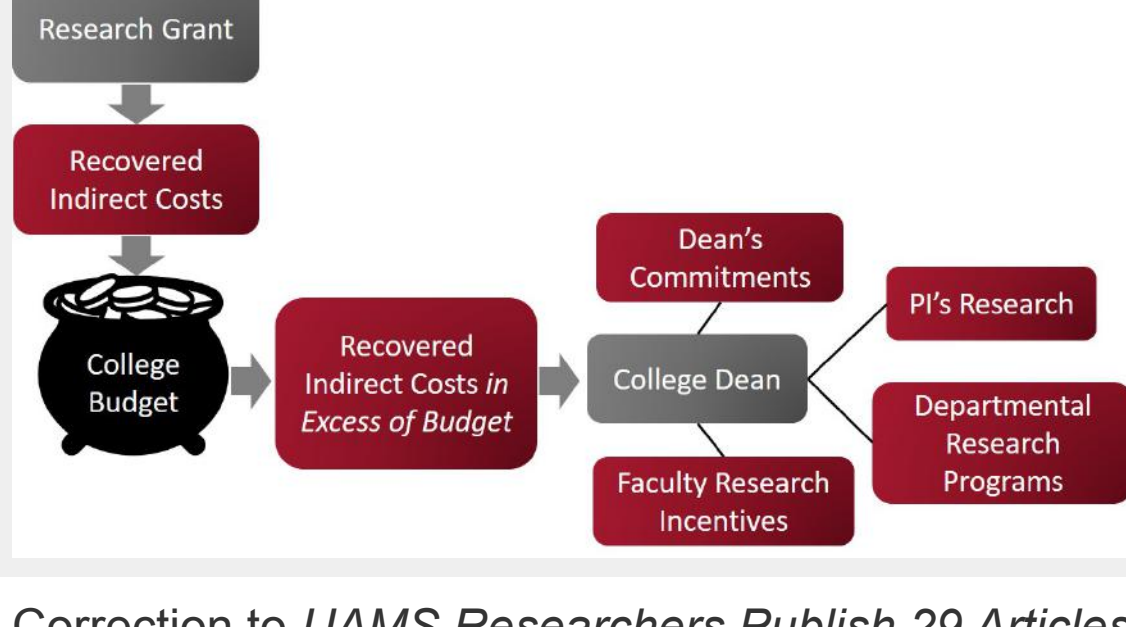

FAQ: What Happens to Recovered Indirect Costs?

Indirect costs are the day-to-day expenses of conducting research. These include overhead expenses (rent, utilities) and general office expenses (administrative personnel salaries and supplies). Indirect costs differ from direct costs in that they cannot be traced back to a specific research project. When an institution receives a grant to conduct research, the grant-maker may reimburse the institution for indirect costs associated with conducting research. At UAMS, recovered indirect costs are returned to the respective college budget. Recovered indirect costs in excess of the budget are disbursed at the discretion of the college dean.
