Change in NIH guidance: Placement of figures in grant proposal

NIH no longer allows figures—i.e., images, graphics, charts, graphs, and tables—to be included in the Specific Aims, Project Summary/Abstract, or Project Narrative attachments. Placing a figure on the Specific Aims page has often been promoted as a good way to help reviewers understand a project's overall design or rationale. However, <u>current guidance from</u> the NIH website says that doing so "may lead to application errors upon submission or withdrawal of your application from funding consideration." If you are preparing a grant application for NIH, include figures in the Research Strategy (i.e., Significance, Innovation, and Approach sections) but not in the Specific Aims page. Questions? Effort certification is required for all UAMS employees who have been paid off of a sponsored project.
